## Foundations

Green Point Christian College was established in 1982 by Green Point Baptist Church with a vision to offer education, based on God's love and grace, to the children of families on the Central Coast. The vision emerged from a desire to have parents' teaching in Christian homes reflected through the education of their children at school. Parents know that Green Point Christian College will back up the faith, integrity and Godliness that they are instilling in their children through home and Church.

The College is located in a most picturesque and peaceful bush setting on the Brisbane Water hinterland near Gosford, NSW. This environment reminds us of the many blessings our Creator God bestows on us.

The reputation of the College as a centre of excellence in the standard of education offered has grown and developed over the years. Our NAPLAN and Higher School Certificate results are a testimony to this development.

As a Christian School our values and beliefs are founded in Jesus Christ and we aim to be obedient to His revealed Word, the Bible. The ultimate aim of the College is to encourage and support our students' development, leading them into a personal relationship with Jesus Christ, giving purpose and direction to their lives.

We live in a challenging society where the Word of God needs to underpin academic, physical and emotional development and we believe it is critical that education should include all these elements.

## Staff

Our staff is qualified and experienced in the teaching and learning process and actively support the development of the children in their care as they grow and mature through the College. Every staff member is a committed Christian in membership at a local Church.

The care and nurture of all students is sustained through the strong Christian commitment of the staff in conjunction with the College's ministry through pastoral care in class groups in Junior School and Devotions classes in Secondary School.

## Care and Discipline

To promote character and a sense of responsibility, we insist on consistent discipline in accordance with our College Behaviour Management Policy. In fulfilling our Policy, we endeavour to operate under grace and justice. Our discipline system functions using "Compliments" and "Demerits" where students are rewarded for positive behaviour and negative behaviour is corrected. Boundaries are clearly established, communicated and reinforced. The College provides professional Counsellors to come alongside students when they need extra care.

# Facilities

The College has excellent facilities and in keeping with advances in technology, we are constantly upgrading our use of Information Technology.

Our buildings are modern and air conditioned and provide specialist facilities for Creative and Performing Arts, Science, Technology including Food and Wood, Computers, Hospitality and Textiles. We have a purpose built Theatrette in our Creative and Performing Arts Centre which is an excellent facility for our whole College with Musicals and Drama being performed each year by our talented students.

Our College Library provides resources to the whole school community along with study areas for our Senior Students. Outdoor and indoor sports are catered for with our oval, courts and Multi-Purpose Centre.



# Opportunities

Our students have the opportunity to be involved in ministry outside the College with our mission trips overseas and to remote Australian communities. The College also organises students to be involved in practical community service such as our Backyard Blitz, Samaritan's Purse and visits to local nursing homes. Extra curricula activities include: Chess, Debating, Mock Trial, College Performances, Worship Band, Choir, College Band, Science and Engineering Challenge and fundraising activities for charities such as Red Cross, World Vision and SAO. Students can also be selected to sit on the Students Representative Council in Junior School.

Students are involved in our camping program in Primary School and Secondary School, with Year 6 visiting Canberra, the Year 7 "Getting to Know Each Other" Camp, the Year 9 Outdoor Education Camp and Year 11 Camp. As well as these camps there are several other opportunities for specialised learning away from the College Campus. These include, the Year 10 Ski Camp for Physical and Sports Studies and the Leadership Day for Prefects. Excursions are held regularly in Junior and Secondary School to support the outcomes of each curriculum area.



# Sport

Our College excels in a wide variety of sports and many of our students are excellent sportsmen and women. This is shown in the number of our students who are chosen to represent our College, Region and State in competitions in sports such as: Swimming, Athletics, Cross Country, Rugby, Soccer, Netball, Cricket, Basketball and many more. Any student who excels at sport will have an opportunity to play at a representative level of his or her ability.

Our College belongs to the Christian Schools Hunter Region Sporting Association, Christian Schools Sports Association (CSSA) and the Combined Independent Schools Association (CIS).

Many of our students go on to represent the College in the CIS Team to compete at the All Schools Carnivals: State and National.





## *Junior School*

The curriculum followed in Infants and Primary is one which will prepare students for entry to Secondary School. Integrated throughout the curriculum is the ethos of the Christian teacher and a Christian world view. As well as the general curriculum, our Junior School students from Kindergarten through to Year 6 are involved in Information Technology (Computers), Language (Japanese), Library and Music, all taught by specialist teachers.

Studies in the Junior School include:

- English

- Science
- Technology and Applied Studies
- Creative Arts: Drama, Dance, Visual Arts, Music
- Personal Development, Health and Physical Education
- History
- Geography
- Languages: Japanese
- Biblical Studies

## *Secondary School*

The College recognises the challenge that students face in moving from Junior School into Secondary School, therefore we recognise that when students progress from Year 6 to Year 7, continuity is important and so students stay with the same group for many subjects. All students in Years 7 and 8 study English, Mathematics, Science, History, Geography, Biblical Studies, PDHPE, Music, Art, Japanese, Computer Skills, Technology and Textiles.

Students in Years 9 and 10 study English, Mathematics, Science, History, Geography, Biblical Studies and PDHPE. These students then choose two electives from a range of subjects which prepares them for entering Year 11 when they will choose all their subjects except English.

At the end of Year 10 all students go through an interview process to confirm their enrolment in Years 11 and 12.

Students in Years 11 and 12 are our Senior Secondary students and have the opportunity to develop their leadership skills through our leadership system of Prefects and Captains of the College who are chosen through an application and interview process. Our Captains and Prefects represent the College at various events throughout the year.

In Years 11 and 12 all subjects are elective except English. Academically students in Years 11 and 12 all prepare for the external Higher School Certificate Examinations at the end of Year 12. Students will have the opportunity to critically reflect on the issues discussed in class and process their personal response in the light of the Bible in special Seminars in Years 11 and 12 to help prepare them for leaving the College.

## *Support Services*

The Green Point Christian College Support Services model is designed to meet the needs of students at both ends of the learning spectrum. The College model upholds our purpose to enable students to develop their potential to its fullest extent in the school environment and in so doing to equip and encourage each student to fulfil a purposeful role in society. Underpinning our model is a continuing commitment to the outworking of Biblical perspectives in our teaching and learning practice.

Support Services K-12 provides an effective and efficient delivery of support across a K-12 continuum with resources allocated to areas of greatest need across Junior and Secondary Schools. Our Gifted Education program seeks to meet the needs of identified students through extension classes in Years 3 to 8 with accelerated patterns of study.

## STATEMENT OF FAITH

### GOD

The Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father and the Son. He convicts people of their sin, leads them to repentance, creates faith within them and regenerates them. ### THE BIBLE

## ENROLMENT POLICY

The vision of Green Point Christian College is *Excellence in Christ Centred Education*. As a ministry of Green Point Baptist Church, the College aims to support Christian parents in the education of their children. However, places are available for children from families that are supportive of the policies of the College but are not practising Christians.

A practising Christian family is considered to be a family who:

- Recognises and testifies to the Lordship of Jesus Christ;
- Has a commitment to model and teach Biblical principles in the home;
- Is actively involved in the ministries of and regularly attends the services of worship in a local Christian church.

The administration of this Enrolment Policy is the responsibility of the Principal of the College. All prospective enrolments are subject to an enrolment interview to ensure that all families with children enrolled in the College are supportive of the ethos and policies of the College.

## APPLICATIONS FOR ENROLMENT

All enquiries and applications for enrolment are to be directed to the Registrar. At the time of enquiry, a College Prospectus will be sent to each family. To cover processing costs, a **non-refundable** Application Fee of \$250 for each child must be included with each Application for Enrolment.

- Completed Application for Enrolment form
- Birth Certificate
- Copies of school reports (if applicable)
- Copies of NAPLAN results (if applicable)
- Recent photo of the student (can be digital or on paper)
- Reference from your Pastor or someone who knows your family well

If, after an interview has been arranged and completed, an offer for placement is made then it is necessary for the College to receive written acceptance of the offer and a non-refundable Enrolment Fee of \$200 before enrolment can proceed.

## WAITING LIST

Where there are no positions available in a particular grade, the applicant's name may be added to the waiting list, should parents so desire. The waiting lists are prioritised as follows:

## INTERVIEW PROCEDURE

The Registrar will arrange an interview for each new applicant and his/her parents (or guardian(s)). That interview, which will usually be conducted by the relevant Head of School but may be conducted by the Deputy Principal, will normally take 30 minutes. Parents must come equipped with any information that may assist in assessment of the application, such as reports, special awards, samples of work, external professional assessments (where appropriate) and any other certificates that the applicant has gained.

The purpose of the interview is for the College to get to know the family and its value system as well as give the College an opportunity to understand the particular gifting of the applicant. The interview is not meant to be a threatening procedure but parents should be prepared, in the confidential nature of the interview, to be open and honest and answer a variety of related questions. Both parents and child are requested to attend this interview. Parents should come prepared to ask any questions about the College and its operation or share any concerns they may have.

Parents will be informed of the decision in relation to their application as soon as possible after the interview. It should be understood that decisions on Enrolment Applications are a matter for the Principal.

## CONDITIONS OF ENROLMENT

All parents are expected to read the Conditions of Enrolment available from the College Website. By signing the Application for Enrolment parents indicate their acceptance of those conditions. The College reserves the right to add to and amend these Conditions of Enrolment from time to time as they see fit. However, any proposed change to the Conditions of Enrolment will be indicated in *The Messenger* and/or on the College's website and an opportunity for comments will be provided before any change is made.

## ATTENDANCE

All students are expected to be in attendance each day of the College year. All students are expected to be in attendance at special College functions, including sports days. Where a child is absent with parental permission, the College is to be notified by either:

- Registering the absence on Parent Lounge - or
- A telephone call to the College's absentee line (4367 9950) - or
- An email to the College office ([absentees@gpcc.nsw.edu.au](mailto:absentees@gpcc.nsw.edu.au)) - or
- A letter sent to the College

If a child is absent and there is no known reason, the parents will be sent an SMS by 11.00am to alert them to the absence and request them to notify the College of the reason.

## COMMUNICATION PROCEDURE

Parents are requested to respect normal operation of the College and not to make direct contact with teachers at their classroom or at home. Any contact with teachers should be done through the office email where an appointment can be made or a teacher requested to telephone a parent.

As the College staff attend devotions each day from 8.15am - 8.30am, parents are requested not to telephone the office before 8.30am. Apart from individual messages, the College will communicate with students and their parents via its weekly newsletter, called The Messenger, and via the College's website, [www.gpcc.nsw.edu.au](http://www.gpcc.nsw.edu.au).

## COMMUNICATION TO PARENTS AND STUDENTS

The College has an Administration System that incorporates Parent and Student portals called, "Parent Lounge" and "Student Cafe". Information, academic reports, timetables, diaries and homework are just some of the facilities available through these portals.

## EXIT PROCEDURES

Where a student is to be withdrawn from the College, parents must give 10 school weeks written notice (school holiday time does not count). Where such notice is not given, the College reserves the right to charge one term's fees.

Any student who is withdrawn must complete a Student Exit Checklist and ensure that all equipment and books are returned. Failure to do so will result in additional charges being levied.

## 2019 FEE SCHEDULE

Fees are billed annually at the beginning of each academic year and may be paid by instalments by entering into a payment plan. It is a requirement of the College for all families to complete a **Fee Payment Commitment Form** at the beginning of each year to advise method of payment.

# Sibling Discounts are available where two or more members of the immediate family concurrently attend the College.

### PAYMENT OF FEES

Termly fees are payable in full within 7 days of commencement of each term unless an existing fee agreement is in place. This agreement is established by the submission of the annual **Fee Payment Commitment Form**.

Quarterly *Fee Statements* are issued at the end of each term and available on the Parent Lounge (<https://parent.gpcc.nsw.edu.au>). If no payment plan is entered into, then fees are to be paid quarterly within 7 days of commencement of each term. Fee payments can be made by Direct Debit (preferred), BPAY®, credit card, EFTPOS, electronic direct credit, cheque or cash.

### PROMPT PAYMENT DISCOUNTS K-12

A prompt Payment Discount of 3% per family (excluding subject levies) is applicable for families who pay the full years' fee account within 7 days of commencement of Term 1.

### ELECTIVE SUBJECT LEVIES

Secondary students undertaking Industrial Technology, Food Technology/Hospitality, Visual Art, Visual Design, Music, Drama, Textiles, Photography, Computer subjects will be required to pay an appropriate fee to cover costs and materials provided by the College.

Students electing to study certain subjects via Distance Education and TAFE will be charged an additional fee.

### EXCURSIONS AND CAMPS

In Primary School, all costs for excursions (but not camps) are included in the above school fees. The annual Year 5 (Bathurst) and Year 6 (Canberra) trips will be billed in January to allow you to incorporate payment as part of your payment commitment for the year.

External academic competitions and Primary Electives will attract a separate fee, which will be charged to your School Fee Account as required. In Secondary School, all costs for camps (held in Years 7 and 9) are included, but all excursion costs will be charged separately as they arise.

## FINANCIAL HARDSHIP

The College acknowledges that some families may experience unexpected short-term financial difficulty and will attempt to offer grace and understanding where there is difficulty in paying school fees. Where problems occur, parents are encouraged to contact the Finance Team or Business Manager before the matter becomes unmanageable. Non-payment of school fees without explanation will be followed up in the normal course of College management and may incur additional charges. Failure to pay fees may result in termination of enrolment.

## @GPCC Program – Years 7 - 10



The College runs a technology program called @GPCC which is an initiative using Apple MacBook Air devices for students in Years 7-10. Parents will be required to provide their student/s with a suitable device. This device can be acquired through the College or purchased privately. Information about the @GPCC program is provided to all new students and available via the College Intranet and also through the “School Life” menu on the website.

## Enrolment and Termination



### APPLICATION FEE: K-12

An Application fee of \$250 per child is payable upon submission of your enrolment application.

### ENROLMENT FEE: K – 12

When a new student is offered a position at the College, a non-refundable Enrolment Fee of \$200 per child will be required to secure the position. The Enrolment Fee is NOT refundable if the student is withdrawn before his/her first day at the College. A Fee Agreement must be filled out and signed prior to any enrolment.

### WITHDRAWAL: K-12

Ten term weeks notice in writing addressed to the Registrar is required if parents decide to remove their child from the College. If this notice is not given, parents will be charged fees + GST in lieu of the period of notice.

## COLLEGE STRUCTURE

Green Point Christian College is structured as follows:

### Primary School

Kindergarten to Year 6

### Secondary School

Secondary	Year 7 to Year 10
Senior Secondary	Year 11 and Year 12

Primary School and Secondary School each have a Head of School who deals with the day to day running of their particular "School". Our Principal has overall responsibility for the College.

### PRIMARY SCHOOL

In the Primary School there are typically two classes in Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 2, with three classes in Years 3 to 6.

Before and After School Care is available to all families of the College.

Support Services operates to meet the special learning needs of all children. Extension opportunities are provided within each class and year level according to need.

### SECONDARY SCHOOL

The Secondary School operates with a 2 week cycle – Red Week and Blue Week. There are 4 x 75 minute Periods each day.

Progression to Secondary School occurs in Year 7 where each student belongs to a Home Class with a Home Room Teacher. Students meet with their Home Room Teacher each day for Devotions and are taught by them in at least one subject area.

Years 7 to 12 are our Secondary years where students have the opportunity to develop their leadership skills in many areas.

Years 11 and 12 are considered our Senior Secondary students and wear a slightly different uniform and have their own common area. In these years the College has a leadership system which incorporates Prefects and Captains of the College who are chosen through an application and interview process.

Before and After School Care is available to all families of the College.

Support Services operates from Kindergarten to Year 12 to meet the special learning needs of all students in the College.

## CURRICULUM

### PRIMARY SCHOOL

The curriculum followed in Infants and Primary is one which will prepare students for entry to Secondary School. Integrated through the curriculum is the ethos of the Christian teacher and a Christian world view. All students are involved in a Music Appreciation program taught by Music teachers. They also study Information Communications Technology (ICT), a Language (Japanese) with a specialist teacher and participate in a Library lesson with the Librarian. ICT skills are taught throughout Primary School using ipads and computers.

### SECONDARY SCHOOL

Our College follows the guidelines of the NSW Education Authority (NESA) in all matters of curriculum. The students sit for the external examinations at the end of Year 12 - the Higher School Certificate.

Within the common guidelines set out by NESA, there is freedom for each school to design, in part, its own curriculum. As with the Primary School, all subjects are taught from a Christian perspective by Christian teachers.

As well as the core subjects of English, Maths and Science, all students must do History/Geography, and choose two elective subjects in Years 9 and 10. In Years 11 and 12 all subjects are elective except English, although students must choose a balanced study pattern. For more information on the Senior years, a separate Information Book is available from the Registrar.

@GPCC is a program driven by curricular and learning objectives. Our vision is that @GPCC presents students with a device which enables them to acquire the skills that empower them in all phases of the learning process, including research, problem solving, content creation, communication and collaboration. Students and families may already have a device that meets these requirements, or may purchase a new device to meet these requirements. The College recommends the MacBook Air 11" laptop computer.

## IMPORTANT NOTES

Appropriate regulation uniform must be worn at school and while travelling to and from school, including school excursions.

Hems on all girls' uniforms K-12 should be set to 2cm above the knee when kneeling. All items of uniform should be clean, neat and have names labelled clearly.

Boy's shirts in Primary and Secondary School are to be worn tucked in at all times.

**HAIR:** Only red or black scrunchies and ribbons are to be used in hair. Girl's hair is to be tied back if longer than shoulder length. Girls in Years 11 and 12 may wear their long hair loose as long as it is off their face. Boys long hair must be tied back in all years.

**MAKE-UP:** No nail polish is to be worn. No make-up is to be worn by students in Years 7-8. Students in Years 9-12 may wear minimal foundation make-up in skin tones.

**JEWELLERY:** As accidents can and do occur with the wearing of jewellery, the only items of jewellery to be worn are:

**Girls Years 7-10-** a watch and one set of sleepers or studs in the ears. Years 11-12 Girls may wear one gold or silver ring, one necklace and one set of sleepers or stud in the ears.

**Boys 7-10 -** No jewellery except a watch. Boys 11-12 may wear one gold or silver ring, one neck chain under shirt. No earrings may be worn for boys.

Secondary students may wear their sports uniform to and from school on the days they have practical PDHPE lessons. On all other days, including those when the students have PDHPE theory, normal school uniform must be worn. If warmth is needed the jumper, multi-purpose jacket or blazer must be worn. A blazer is compulsory for Years 11 to 12.

A choice of either the dress hat, bucket hat or sports cap must be worn while at school in the sun in the playground. The College has a "No hat, no play" policy.
