Mercy Catholic College is highly regarded for its provision of excellence in education that is underpinned by the Catholic faith, and for building a strong sense of community.

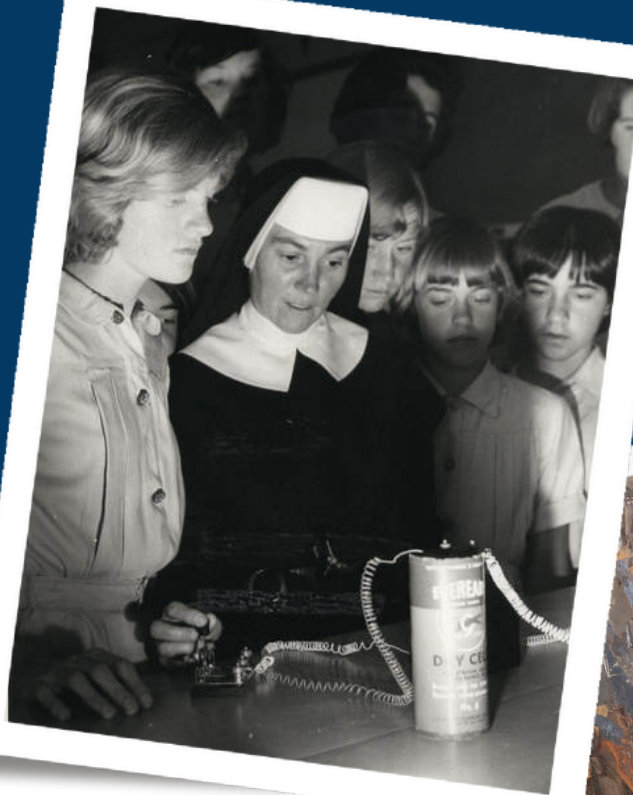

OUR HERITAGE

Mercy Catholic College was established by the Sisters of Mercy in 1890 and has been on the present site since 1905.

The Sisters of Mercy were founded by Catherine McAuley in 1831 in Dublin, Ireland. The Sisters of Mercy were known as pioneering women who were daring and generous in their mission to reach out to the needs of others by providing education, hospitality and pastoral care, particularly to women.

The Sisters administered the College until 1989 and since then it has been part of Catholic Schools Broken Bay, a system of schools whose mission it is to provide an authentic, professional Catholic education delivered with care and compassion.

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STUDENT WELLBEING

WE PROVIDE A CARING EDUCATIONAL ENVIRONMENT WHERE EACH STUDENT IS KNOWN AND CARED FOR AS AN INDIVIDUAL AND WHERE SHE FEELS INCLUDED WITHIN THE CLASSROOM AND THE COLLEGE COMMUNITY.

Mercy Catholic College recognises the worth of each individual. We value the role of the individual within our community, encouraging the understanding that rights must be balanced with responsibilities.

Students are encouraged to develop strong relationships and interact in a positive way with their peers and staff. Specialised staff including the Assistant Principal: Evangelisation, Catechesis and Student Wellbeing, the Year Co-ordinators, the College Counsellor and the Youth Minister work with students on a wide variety of projects involving faith development, social justice and wellbeing.

Students are assisted to develop an understanding of the importance of personal goals, their words, actions and commitment, in relation to learning and living in the school and wider community.

Based on a framework of positive psychology our well-developed pastoral care structure allows support for student's wellbeing. The framework is also supported by programmes including our Vertical Tutor Group system, structured around the College Houses – Mercy, McAuley, Coolock and Stormanston.



TEACHING AND LEARNING

Underpinned by the Catholic Schools Broken Bay 'Towards 2025' vision, the goal of the College is to establish a positive culture of learning that enables each child to achieve their best.

We provide a wealth of opportunities for students to become confident, resilient and independent learners.

A wide range of courses are offered and throughout their time at the College students are given informed advice around subject choices which balance personal interest and challenge to support progression through to university, TAFE and other pathways.

Our teachers take responsibility for educating and inspiring young learners to achieve success. Professional development of staff assists teachers in the design and delivery of high quality learning programmes.

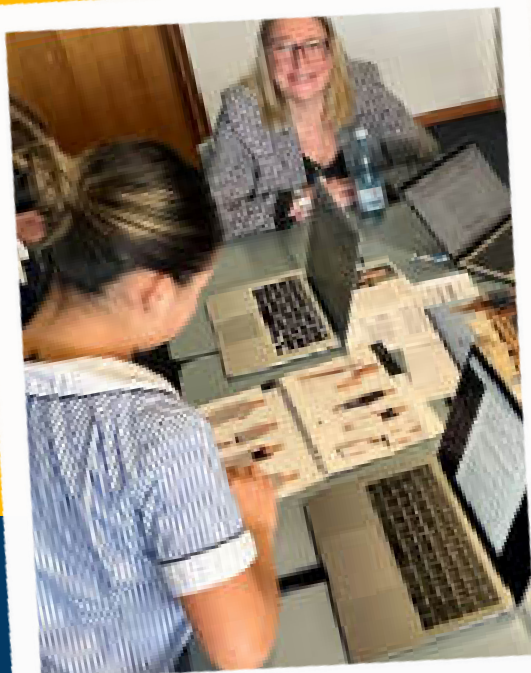

ENROLMENT

The Enrolment Committee welcomes all applications and follows the Catholic Schools Broken Bay Enrolment Policy which can be found on our website.

For Year 7 enrolment, applications are welcome up to 3 years prior to commencement (i.e. in Year 4). Offers of enrolment are usually made 2 years prior to commencement (i.e. Year 5). Whilst early application to our schools is encouraged, it does not guarantee placement.

We welcome families wishing to apply for Years 8-12 at any time throughout the year. All applications will be considered but are subject to spaces being available and our Enrolment Principles.

If you are coming from a Catholic Schools Broken Bay (CSBB) primary school, you may be eligible for priority entry to the College (subject to enrolment windows) and a range of other benefits as part of this program. Please note, students from Priority Feeder Schools still need to advise us of their interest in Mercy Catholic College by following the application process.
