Our world-class facilities are set amongst beautiful landscaped and historical grounds, in the heart of the North Sydney CBD. Facilities include state-of-the-art learning spaces and technologies, indoor Aquatics and Sports Centre and a dedicated Performing Arts spaces.

A Dual Program: HSC and IB

Monte Sant' Angelo Mercy College provides an exceptional education tailored to the unique needs of girls, fostering an environment where each student is inspired to thrive academically, socially, and personally. With a commitment to learning, the College challenges every young woman to deepen her understanding, and build the confidence and skills needed to succeed in a rapidly evolving world. By nurturing a love for learning and empowering students to reach their full potential, the College prepares the next generation of women to lead, innovate, and contribute meaningfully to their communities.

We are proud to offer the International Baccalaureate (IB) Middle Years Programme in Years 7 to 10 as the framework to deliver the NSW curriculum, and both the Higher School Certificate (HSC) and the IB Diploma Programme as pathways to academic excellence in Years 11 and 12. The approaches to learning include critical thinking, problem solving, public speaking, professional writing, teamwork, digital literacy, leadership, work ethic, career management and intercultural fluency.

HSC or IB Diploma – what is the difference?

Both the HSC and the IB Diploma require students to commit to a significant workload and both courses of study require students to be willing to develop independent learning skills as well as effective time management and organisational skills. The choice between the HSC and the IB Diploma is made by students, taking into account their own learning styles and subject preferences. Resources at Monte are equitably shared by students in both programs.







Co-Curricular

All students are encouraged to take part in a diverse range of co-curricular activities such as music, debating, public speaking, sports, performing arts and Duke of Edinburgh's Award, and other opportunities, which enhance their leadership, resilience, wellbeing and teamwork skills for the future.

The College encourages a high level of participation as part of our "Sport for All" program.

Although sport is not compulsory at Monte, we have elite sport pathways and opportunities for participation that focus on being part of a team and expanding friendship groups.

Our community also enjoys Drama evenings, House Plays, Debating and many clubs where students have opportunities to discover and develop their individual skills, talents and interests.

Mercy in Action

Community and Service have always been fundamental aspects of a Monte Sant' Angelo Mercy College education, as students are shaped by the values of Mercy, Justice, Service, Human Dignity and Option for the Poor.

Mercy in Action includes:

Mercy Action Group

 The Mercy Action Group advocates for many social justice issues, such as the No Child Left Behind Campaign, Climate Change, Gender Equality and Fair Trade Fashion. The students also run a Fair Trade Café, serving drinks and snacks to raise awareness for global equal working conditions for all.

Green Team

 The Green Team is committed to promoting sustainability, raising awareness and leading initiatives for our environment.
The Green Team have introduced solar panels to increase the College's usage of renewable energy and established hives for stingless native bees, which help preserve native ecology.

Biamunga

 Biamunga is a journey of discovery that can offer learning from First Nations peoples' spiritual and cultural values. At Monte, the Biamunga Mob explore language, Indigenous art and craft, cooking, Wagaji (ceremonial dance), wellness and meditation in fortnightly meetings. They also discuss current events and political issues and opportunities for connection and advocacy. The College celebrates NAIDOC Week with activities and guest artists from the community at Mutitjulu and hosts Biamunga Yarn-Up, a sharing of stories and experiences with guest speakers.

Debating

Debating encourages and challenges the girls to engage critically and constructively with each other, exploring the most controversial, pressing and ageold questions facing our society. During the school year, a large number of students participate in the key debating competitions.

Monte also hosts beginner primary school debating and public speaking programs for future students which focus on skill development, and primary teams are able to compete for Monte in the ISDA competition.









Duke of Edinburgh's Award

The Duke of Edinburgh's Award offers students a unique opportunity to involve themselves in an internationally renowned program designed to develop skills that prepare them for life beyond the College.

Students are required to complete four components, including the Adventurous Journey, a skill activity, physical recreation and a volunteer component, as well as a Residential Project in the Gold Award level. The students' perseverance and initiative are developed while undertaking activities such as hiking, canoeing and camping.

Cultural Immersions

Cultural immersions at Monte are a platform to increase students' global awareness and understanding as these experiences allow students to continue the legacy of the Sisters of Mercy through advocating for positive change in society.

Timor-Leste Immersion and Fundraising Program

The fundamental reason for our ongoing support in Timor-Leste is to continue the work of the Sisters of Mercy by affording the opportunity of a quality education to all young women at the Colegio Infante de Sagre School in Maliana. As well as an annual immersion visiting Timor-Leste and the Maliana community, Monte students fundraise and advocate for change and empowerment for the young women.

Cambodia Mercy Immersion

The Cambodia Mercy Immersion includes crosscultural experiences, historical adventures, volunteer work and meeting with Nobel Prize winners. This immersion offers students the unique opportunity to discover the culture of Cambodia, build and enhance relationships, extend themselves beyond their comfort zone, develop their independence and put their Mercy values into action.

Central Desert Community Engagement Program

The aim of this program is for students to experience a cultural exchange through hands-on activities and guidance by Anangu, maintaining a mutual relationship for our communities to learn and grow. The group undertakes extensive training before departure, including meetings, workshops and learning some of the local language in order to get the most out of this Community Engagement Program.









Industry Partnerships and Entrepreneurship Programs

Monte proudly offers industry and entrepreneurial opportunities to students which facilitate the building of transferable skills and harness creative inquests, to transform our girls into professional women, ready for life beyond the College.

Industry Partnership Programs

The 'I Can Code' program encourages students to develop critical thinking and problem-solving skills that are applicable to a range of different career pathways. Learning to code is the main component of this program but students are also able to meet with industry experts and gain insights into what it is like to work in the technology industry. This program goes for the entire academic year and consists of five modules.

The 'Inspiring STEM+' program provides students with the opportunity to experience the engineering and construction industry in real-life and real-time. It also explores a diverse range of professions the construction industry can offer such as surveying, commercial property, law, environment and sustainable practices, design and finance. This is a two-year program which covers eight modules.

Entrepreneurship Program

The Entrepreneurship Program at Monte offers students in Years 7 to 11 an exciting opportunity to dive into the world of startups and innovation. Through hands-on skill-building and immersive experiences, students are encouraged to develop and pitch their own ideas to engaged audiences. The program includes bootcamps, guest speaker sessions with industry leaders actively shaping the startup space, and the chance to collaborate with our Entrepreneur-in-Residence.

The highlight of the program is the opportunity to present their startups at the annual Entrepreneur Showcase held at the College. Since its inception, the program has seen a remarkable range of student-driven startups emerge, from Buyers Agents Apps to Fair Trade businesses—some of which have transitioned into real-life ventures. Students have also earned recognition, winning awards at Student Pitch Nights at Macquarie University.





Performing Arts

Drama and Theatre

Monte's co-curricular Drama and Theatresports offer a fantastic platform for students to unleash their creativity, ignite their imagination, and develop skills in communication and collaboration.

Screen and Stage Skills (SASS)

Students discover the foundations of acting and unlock their potential on the stage and screen. SASS empowers students with tools to participate in theatrical endeavours, laying the groundwork for further Drama and Theatre Studies at Monte and beyond. Students learn acting fundamentals such as listening and characterisation. This course is exclusively offered to Year 7 and 8 students.

Musicals

Students and the wider community come together to immerse themselves in the enchanting world of musical theatre as they engage in awe-inspiring performances. Monte's annual musical productions are a highlight of the College year, showcasing the extraordinary talents of Monte students. Whether students dream of gracing the stage with their presence or prefer to work behind the scenes as part of the stage and technical crews, there is a role for everyone. Each year, Monte strives to deliver an even more spectacular show, with past productions including beloved favourites like Frozen JR., Matilda JR., Wicked, Mulan JR., High School Musical and The Sound of Music.

Theatresports

Students can unleash their spontaneity and quick thinking with Theatresports. Through engaging improvisational exercises, students build confidence and skills. Working collaboratively in teams, students develop characters, create settings, and improvise short scenes based on a variety of exciting scenarios, games, and challenges. Theatresports is a thrilling and dynamic experience that nurtures creativity and builds resilience.

Music Theatre Club

For students who have a passion for singing, dancing, and acting, the Music Theatre Club is the perfect fit. Open to all year groups, this club meets regularly to prepare songs, scenes, and dances from popular shows. Students showcase their talents through various performances throughout the year, where they have the opportunity to shine and share their love for musical theatre with others who share the same passion.

Music



Physical Activity and Engagement

The Physical Activity & Engagement Department at Monte Sant' Angelo Mercy College plays a pivotal role in promoting student wellness through a diverse range of physical activities, structured fitness classes, and workshops. Led by a team of experienced professionals in Physical Performance, Sports Science and Nutrition, the department fosters a supportive environment where students of all interests and abilities can engage in physical activity before, during and after school.

The department offers supervised access to state-of-the-art facilities, such as the Scientia Gym and McQuoin Cardio Room. Weekly team strength and conditioning sessions complement sports training, while structured exercise classes—such as virtual cycling, boxing, and Pilates—cater to students seeking fitness beyond traditional sports. Lunchtime activities, including Olympic-themed events, friendly competitions, and skill-building challenges, further enhance the student experience.

Additionally, the department supports students through programs like 'Active Breaks for Active Brains,' which help manage exam stress and improve focus. By integrating cuttingedge technology and expert guidance, the Physical Activity & Engagement Department is dedicated to nurturing both the physical and mental wellbeing of all students, ensuring they thrive academically and personally.

Pastoral Care & Wellbeing

Monte prides itself on the role the staff and community play in the shaping of our young women. Our aim is to ensure every student is cared for with dignity and compassion to ensure they grow into self-confident young women capable of acting with honesty and integrity and above all, mercy.

The Pastoral Care Program is run within year levels. Tutor Groups meet each morning, enabling the interaction and participation of students and teachers in a small, personal environment. Each year group meets as a whole form on a regular basis to experience the integrated program of social and emotional care. Pastoral Care camps are held throughout the year and complement the program of development and personal growth.

A representative from each Tutor Group is elected to the Student Representative Council (SRC) which meets regularly to discuss issues of interest and concern to the whole student body. The SRC is responsible for many initiatives aimed at raising the level of social awareness among students and for planning fundraising activities in support of disadvantaged groups in the wider community.

The College uses the GROWTH model which focuses on:

- Building resilience
- Expecting and role-modelling positive behaviours
- A safe school environment where students are able to reflect, give feedback and contribute to the betterment of the community
- Restorative practices for discipline issues
- Social and emotional learning

Access to specialist care services is available as required for students with health, welfare, study and special needs. Resources include:

Centrally located in North Sydney, the College combines state-of-the-art learning facilities with buildings of architectural and historical significance.




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
