

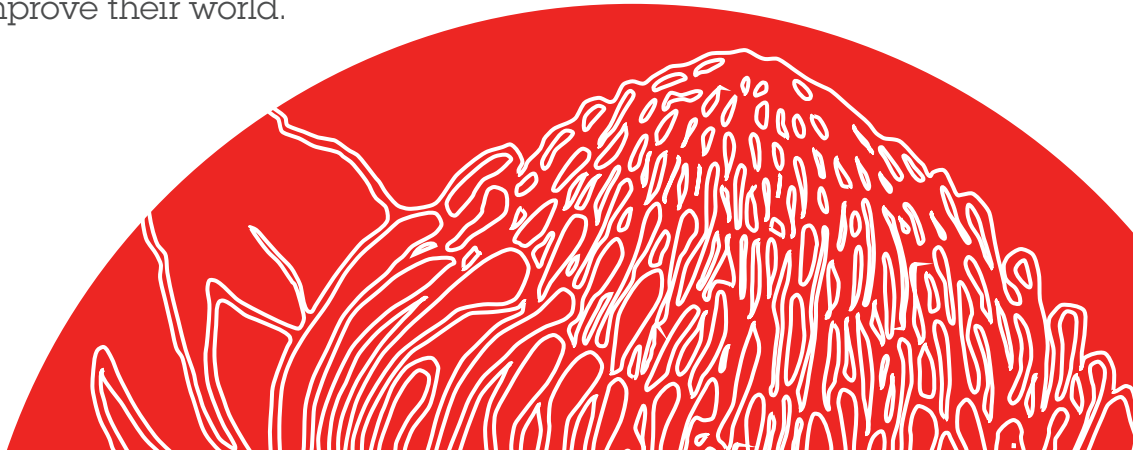

Inspire confident, creative and active learners

Our core purpose is learning. We want learning at NAC to be effective, inspirational and valued by all members in our community.

PEOPLE

- Foster a culture of learning which engages our learning community collaboratively.
- Celebrate learning in all areas! Focus on learning as a vehicle for effective performance and achievement.
- Attract, develop and retain passionate, inspirational staff.
- Invest in leadership at all levels in our community.
- Enable HSC success by actively seeking to ensure that our Year 11 and 12 students are prepared for success in their final years of study and beyond, with a whole school approach to learning.

PLACE

- Apply research to create effective learning environments that inspire collaboration and include the latest technologies.
- Strengthen the library to be a learning hub of innovation and excitement for our whole community.

PEDAGOGY

- Focus on learning for all members of our community by implementing the research supported program Building Learning Power as a major cultural teaching and learning framework to influence educational outcomes across the College.
- Expand the EDGE Centre to ensure that the individual learning needs of every student at Nowra Anglican College are met.

PROCESS

- Apply rigorous assessment and evaluation to measure the effectiveness of pedagogical practice within the College.
- Deploy specialist administrative support for growth learning areas.

Strengthen our holistic approach to Christian Education

With the Christian faith core to our learning community the implementation of a holistic approach to Christian Education, seeks to positively influence all areas of student wellbeing and learning. We will provide opportunities for staff and students to appreciate Biblical teaching and the impact this can have on their lives.

- Over the next five years, we will expand our chaplaincy and Christian Studies team.

- Create a designated chaplaincy 'home', and further integrate the bush chapel into the day-to-day operations of the College.

- Establish a cohesive and sequential P-12 pastoral care framework that reflects Christian values.

PROCESS

- Incorporate regular chaplaincy events and messages into College communications.

Grow healthy relationships to engage our learning community

NAC recognises positive community engagement is essential to grow a learning community. NAC will engage with all stakeholders to ensure trust, open communication and a healthy exchange of ideas.

We particularly acknowledge the need for cross-cultural engagement in a spirit of reconciliation with First Nation people, and the benefits this brings to students.

PEOPLE

- Create opportunities to influence learning beyond our staff and students and into the community.
- Connect with local community groups, churches and professional organisations, including the Defence community, for mutual support and real-world engagement for our students.
- Grow and promote cross-cultural engagement by connecting with our local

Indigenous elders and increasing the Aboriginal Education Mentor staffing.

- Stay connected through implementing an alumni network.

PLACE

- Connect with our aboriginal heritage through a Koori walk and more yarning circles throughout the College.
- Ensure the College is intentional in developing a welcoming and culturally appropriate environment.
- Encourage the use of our facilities to support the broader Shoalhaven community's learning.

PEDAGOGY

- Embed connection with community groups into our teaching and learning practice.

PROCESS

- Create vibrant connections and effective communications with families and the wider Shoalhaven community using a range of channels and strategies.

Cultivate sustainable practices to secure long-term futures

We recognise the gift of excellent resources – people, knowledge, equipment and facilities. Tailor co-curricular opportunities to develop the whole child

Research indicates that students who participate in co-curricular activities develop higher academic results, better relationships at school, and are more likely to lead healthy, active lifestyles after school. Additionally there are links to higher self-esteem and an increased sense of belonging when students participate in sport, clubs and performing arts. We will improve the quality of activities on offer that support the academic program at Nowra Anglican College.

PEOPLE

- Increase staffing levels to assist in operational logistics for sport and the performing arts.
- Create and implement an integrated cohesive service and leadership program for all students.

- Source qualified and passionate staff and students to provide leadership and coaching to expand the NAC Sports Academy.
- Better resource staff to facilitate co-curricular activities in a broad range of areas.

PLACE

- Plan and commence building works on a sporting precinct.
- Invest in performance venues and entertainment equipment that encourages the performing arts.

PEDAGOGY

- Inspire passion and development of Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics through STEAM inside and outside the classroom.

PROCESS

- Implement processes for more effective administration, promotion and communication that support participation in co-curricular activities and events.

Building Learning Power

A new program preparing students 'not for a life of tests but for the tests of life'.

Building Learning Power is a proven approach to help students become better learners, to face difficulties and uncertainty calmly, confidently and creatively. Nowra Anglican College will adopt the Building Learning Power approach to ensure our students learn to be resourceful, imaginative, self-disciplined and collaborative; all important attributes for success in our modern world.

The EDGE (Enrichment, Differentiation, Gifted Education) Centre, through innovative, research based programs, supports differentiation across the College to meet the needs of all students. Students who require a specialised learning program in either learning support or extension in gifted education will be encouraged or extended through our EDGE Centre. This is an important area of growth to ensure the College is at the forefront of education in the Shoalhaven.

Major Facilities Development

Nowra Anglican College has strong momentum in enrolments, which has placed pressure on its facilities.

We have a comprehensive plan to expand our College with flexible learning spaces that comfortably accommodate our re-envisioned learning and teaching framework. The building work to extend our Junior School precinct will be completed in 2018, encompassing five new classrooms. We will also be investing in state-of-the-art technology rooms, allowing us to reimagine and repurpose the current technology rooms. The traffic management plan will also be implemented.






Preschool Expansion

The new Banksia Room will increase the opportunity for more pre-schoolers to access our innovative and holistic early education.

The College has purchased a property adjacent to the school campus, on West Bunberra Street, to develop a third preschool room – Banksia as part of Bomaderry Community Preschool (BCPS). BCPS is a leader in the provision of innovative and holistic early education.

We recognise and value each child as competent, capable individuals who are active participants in the learning process. Children are immersed in a beautiful, nurturing and stimulating environment where exploration, discovery, collaboration and play provide a platform for children to become successful learners and confident, creative individuals.
