Our commitment to delivering an excellent Kindergarten to Year 12 Christian education to aspiring families in Western Sydney continues to drive all we do at R.J.


We offer meaningful learning pathways tailored to individual interests and capabilities and provide abundant opportunities for students to thrive in a safe and nurturing environment.

JUNIOR SCHOOL YEARS K-6

Embark on the exciting Junior School journey of discovery and learning at RJ! Our dedicated educators immerse children in the world of formal schooling, fostering a love for learning whilst building their confidence and the skills they need to flourish.

Founded on Christian values, our safe and supportive environment encourages children to explore their creativity, curiosity and other God-given gifts and talents. Our Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 2 classes work in smaller classes to develop a strong grounding in literacy and numeracy skills and grow to become adaptable, flexible, and resilient in their learning.

At RJ, learners' natural curiosity is nurtured with a wide range of learning experiences designed to promote independent, self-directed learning habits. RJ students feel safe to explore, question, and think, but also to make mistakes and know that this is part of the learning process, thereby providing growth opportunities. We call this 'failing forward'.

In Junior School, we understandably prioritise literacy and numeracy skills, employing effective programs and additional staffing to ensure each student progresses well. Regular communication with parents is through the class 'Seesaw' program. In our tech-enhanced classrooms, we strike a balance, valuing the essential teacher-student relationship for optimal development.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP & SERVICE

DIVERSE LEARNING NEEDS

Each student has their own individual learning needs. Classroom practices to support students include:

- Differentiated instruction

Gifted and talented students are provided with more challenging learning experiences with greater depth and complexity.

High potential learners have the ability to perform at a level above their age-peers, with an enriched or extended curriculum promoting creative and critical thinking and rich open-ended tasks.

Inclusive practices and a tiered learning model ensure students with disability and/or additional learning needs can access and participate in education along with their peers.

Senior students may do further study after school in 'The Hub' under staff supervision.

Students are able to utilise College resources, to interact with peers in collaborative discussions, and may seek staff assistance for assignments, home learning, etc.

How to enrol



ENROLMENT PROCESS

READ THE CONDITIONS OF ENROLMENT
In accepting and signing an Acceptance of an 'Offer of Enrolment', you will be agreeing to the Anglican Schools Corporation's Conditions of Enrolment. These documents set out the terms of the enrolment contract between the parents and the Anglican Schools Corporation.

2 APPLICATION FOR ENROLMENT
Complete an Application online and pay the \$50 non-refundable Application fee.

WE REVIEW YOUR APPLICATION

The Registrar will review your Application and confirm your child's inclusion in the Application Pool.

BE PATIENT

The Principal will review your Application as positions become available. As a guide, Year 7 and Kinder Applications are usually reviewed in Term 1 of the preceding year.

OFFER OF ENROLMENT

Once the College has decided to offer a place for your child, you will be issued with an online Offer of Enrolment to be signed and submitted with the non-refundable Acceptance Fee.

Please be aware that Kindy and Year 7 spaces fill up very quickly. Applications over 18 months ahead are encouraged.





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
