Pastoral Care & Wellbeing

We are proud of our strong reputation for the highest quality pastoral care. We recognise each student and encourage them to find their personal greatness. Our comprehensive Pastoral Care Program focuses on promoting wellbeing, connectedness, resilience and positive relationships, and contributes to our ongoing reputation as a caring, inclusive community.

We ensure balanced and diverse growth through a College-wide focus on what we call our **St Leo's Growth Domains** – the Spiritual, Academic, Cultural, Social/Emotional, Environmental and Physical development areas of every student.



St Leo's has a renowned transition-to-high-school program with a dedicated team including a Transition Year Leader. After Year 7, students have the same Year Leader and Mentor teacher to ensure continuity of care through until they finish Year 12.

Mentor teachers work with each student to develop a sense of belonging at St Leo's and assist in helping them set goals and reflect on their individual growth

Our pastoral programs include retreats, outdoor programs such as camps and pastoral days which are developed in alignment with the St Leo's Pastoral Care and Wellbeing Guidelines and informed by the Australian Student Wellbeing Framework (ASWF) 2018.



Catholic Life & Mission

St Leo's is first and foremost a Catholic school, with the religious dimension a shared partnership between families, parish communities and the College.

Religion is an essential and comprehensive area of study for all students, prayer an important part of daily life, regular religious gatherings and celebrations not only embraced but enthusiastically led by students, and Christian leadership fostered through our Youth Ministry Program.

As part of their transition into Year 7, all students from across the Broken Bay Diocese attend a 'Belong' formation day. A special day of fun, music, connection and faith formation. Special guests include our Bishop and Director of Schools.

Two school days per year-group are dedicated to our Pastoral Care and Spirituality Program. Later in their St Leo's journey, senior students attend a three day retreat.

A real sense of community exists at St Leo's and our newly refurbished Chapel is the spiritual heart, where students have the option to attend weekly activities including Mass and the Rosary.



Our Faith in Action – Social Justice

There is a significant focus at St Leo's on putting our faith into action and giving students agency and confidence to build a world that is positive, just and inclusive.

Our Evangelisation and Catechesis staff empower students to put their faith into action with a wide range of social justice opportunities.

The College's Vinnies Conference is involved in regular fundraising activities including Project Compassion and the annual Christmas Appeal. They have also led students to raise over \$130,000 since 2021 participating in the Vinnies Winter Sleepout, making St Leo's the highest achieving fundraising school in NSW for the past four years in a row and funding a new Vinnies Van for the Central Coast.

Students from Years 7-12 can express their passion to make a difference in our world by participating in activities with our Social Justice or Social Welfare Awareness Groups. Students are also encouraged to make an impact through our EarthCare Environmental Group and programs such as Clean4Shore.

Community outreach opportunities include Street Retreats in the city learning about homelessness, visits to local nursing homes, and cooking and serving meals at local food charity, The Dish as well as Vinnies Vans.



Our College Facilities – Ready for the Future

St Leo's is privileged to have state-of-the-art facilities across our beautiful six hectare campus following a \$30M building and technology upgrade.

Our extensive facilities include:

- the high-tech Mary MacKillop Centre for Creative and Performing Arts, Design, Technology and Hospitality, includes:
 - a Dance theatre with retractable seating
 - separate Drama studio
 - art gallery and Visual Arts studios
 - specialty Music, rehearsal rooms and individual instrumental tuition rooms
 - two commercial-grade Hospitality kitchens
 - two large TAS workshops for woodwork
 - several large meeting and gallery spaces
 - numerous purposeful and flexible learning spaces

- The Light of Christ Centre – a flexible, multipurpose complex for over 1500 people used for indoor sports, whole-school assemblies and Masses, musical productions and a range of College other activities, functions and events
- our refurbished historic Chapel
- gym and two full-sized sports ovals
- two large, shaded outdoor recreational areas and extensive surrounding natural bushland
- a vibrant, well-equipped Library and Learning Hub with extensive study spaces
- refurbished canteen.

We have a distinct innovation and technology focus, offering a range of programs to ensure our students have the lifelong skills they need for success in a globalised world.

Technology is an integral part of daily learning at St Leo's, with individual student laptops and other learning technologies serving as important tools in developing critical thinking, creativity, collaboration and communication skills.

Our experience has found that technology-enabled teaching and learning allows for more active engagement and allows teachers to meet each student at their particular point of learning. Students are encouraged and provided with the tools and information to advance their skills in a safe environment.

Our innovative Pathways and Partnerships Program works with students and their families to navigate life beyond school, developing industry and higher education partnerships and opportunities, and shaping new offerings and approaches to learning at St Leo's.

We have an interdisciplinary approach to innovation, where students apply skills to make connections between school, community, work and the global

enterprise. We work with a range of industry experts on real-world applications and challenge-based learning activities to also foster collaboration, teamwork and other essential skills while having fun.

We run a number of technology-based co-curricular and extracurricular activities for students of all levels including robotics, software and coding opportunities.

CAPA: an extraordinary 20+ extra-curricular ensembles are offered, from Accordion to Rock Group, Performance Band, Drama Club, Photography, Art Club to numerous Dance Ensembles including Jazz, Hip Hop and Pom.

Sport: A huge range of sports are offered as part of our weekly Sport for Life program. In addition, we have a tiered representative and high-performance program up to state, national and international levels.



Beyond the Classroom – Creative & Performing Arts

The Creative and Performing Arts (CAPA) are an integral part of the curriculum at St Leo's.

St Leo's CAPA specialises in Music, Dance, Drama and Visual Arts for Years 7 -12.

Our award-winning Mary MacKillop Centre highlights our commitment to the arts and includes a dance theatre with fully retractable seating, art galleries and studios along with dedicated orchestra, band and music rooms and a separate drama studio.

An exceptional music program includes various band, ensemble and choir programs, and an annual musical or drama production. Additionally, the College offers an impressive 20+ extra-curricular CAPA Ensembles and specialist Private Music Tuition.

Our annual HSC Showcase is an impressive community event featuring outstanding student major works across Creative & Performing Arts, Design & Technology, and other creative areas.

St Leo's students regularly win awards and Eisteddfods, and are frequently invited to exhibit at ARTEXPRESS and ENCORE. Our exceptional, award-winning CAPA team is especially proud to have had several students offered places at NIDA over recent years, achieved a First in State for HSC Drama in 2021 and a performance selection to CALLBACK in 2024.
