Faith Lutheran College is a Christ-centred community serving the educational needs of individuals and families through high-quality, holistic co-education.

As a rural secondary school, we provide an extensive range of learning opportunities for students in Years 7-12, including pathways that lead to University, trade-based qualifications through Vocational Education and Training (VET), and direct entry into the workforce.

Established in 1999, Faith Lutheran College is situated within the expanding rural community of Plainland, mid-way between Ipswich and Toowoomba in South-East Queensland. Providing educational opportunities from Year 7 to Year 12, and beginning from an initial cohort of 40 learners, the College has grown to accommodate more than 750 students.

Purpose-built to cater for education across the Lockyer Valley and Greater Western Brisbane regions, our campus footprint encompasses 70 acres of land, designed to support a diverse curriculum of teaching and learning.

The space afforded by our rural setting enables our College to offer a number of specialised facilities for students, including a fully-equipped agricultural and rural operations precinct, a multi-discipline trade training centre, an industry grade hospitality training kitchen, and a state-of-the-art sports auditorium and fitness centre.

At Faith, we believe that curiosity is at the heart of learning, and that education extends far outside of the classroom. Our curriculum is designed to amplify the passions and God-given gifts of each individual student – providing opportunities to explore a broad range of pathways, engage with a diverse range of learning styles, and pursue their own unique journey to a successful career – and life – beyond school.



Operating with the understanding that student wellbeing and academic excellence go hand-in-hand, our educational approach incorporates the latest educational research to help support and encourage modern learners; empowering each student to achieve individual excellence.

Designed to both prepare students for success in post-school life, and equip them for future vocation, our teaching and learning philosophy centres around the individual development of students to become self-regulated and reflective learners through:

Our vision is for each learner to play an active role in their own development; building the knowledge, developing the skills and gaining the experiences they will need to succeed in the 21st Century world.

Above all, our classroom leaders are passionate about equipping and empowering students to grow into their future vocational calling; utilising their own God-given gifts as educators, curriculum experts and leaders, to help each individual learner succeed.

Contemporary Learning

Contemporary Learning is about recognising that our world is changing rapidly, and educating our students for success in a future that may be vastly different from the present.

At Faith, all of our teaching and learning staff are trained in Contemporary Learning methods, and hold expertise in combining explicit teaching strategies with flexible learning opportunities.

This means that the development of key skills – including creativity, collaboration, critical thinking and problem solving – are woven into every subject, activity and lesson our students participate in.

Learning For Life

As a College, we view our role as one of preparation - equipping and empowering our students for lives of fulfilment, purpose and vocation beyond formal schooling.

Increasingly, the future is calling for lifelong learners; citizens of an interconnected global society who will continue to learn across their lifespan, building on existing knowledge, acquiring new skills and investing in new opportunities for self-development throughout.

Our curriculum is designed not only to teach, but to cultivate a love of learning, providing opportunities for students to develop key skills that will prepare them for life - and to continue learning long after their formal Secondary education is complete.



Welcoming our youngest learners with a specialised focus on support, individualised learning, community connection, and skills for the future.

Making the transition from Primary into Secondary schooling can be both challenging and exciting for young learners.

At Faith, we draw on the latest research in education and neuroscience to provide a teaching and learning environment that welcomes new students, emphasises familiarity and daily routine, and builds strong skill-based foundations for optimal learning as students progress into the middle and senior years of their education.

Recognising that the first year of secondary school is foundational to the learning that occurs in the Middle and Senior Years of education, our approach to Year 7 is characterised by:



Greater individualisation of teaching and learning, including tailored intervention and acceleration strategies



An ability to plan complimentary units and projects across core curriculum areas to facilitate the acquisition of skills, as well as knowledge/content.



A collaborative approach to student wellbeing, underpinned by deeper relationships with each individual student



A harmonious approach to the introduction of greater student choice in learning, preparing younger students for self-motivated and self-directed study in later years.

Dedicated Teaching and Learning Staff

Enrolling your student in Year 7 at Faith Lutheran College marks the beginning of many 'new' things: a new educational journey, a new environment to explore, new classmates to meet, new experiences to navigate and new subjects to investigate.

To ensure our Year 7 learners are provided with the best possible beginning to their Secondary schooling, we employ a group of highly experienced teaching staff who work solely with our Year 7 classes, providing a greater capacity to implement explicit teaching strategies for individual learners.

Project and Thematic-Based Learning

Our Year 7 students routinely engage in project, theme or concept-based learning – units of work which include the exploration of topics across multiple curriculum areas.

These units help to connect key concepts to real-world examples and perspectives, and play a key role in developing young learners' capacities for analysis, inquiry, collaboration, visible and critical thinking – foundational skills which help to support students to continue learning as they grow.

Project-Based Learning (PBL) has also been observed to reduce anxiety around assessment (as units of work may serve as assessable across different curriculum areas), helping to produce a more engaging, more authentic, and often, more exciting learning experiences for our Year 7 and Middle Years students.

Timetables Designed for Optimal Learning

Research from the areas of neuroscience and metacognition show that different times of the day are best suited to different modes of learning, particularly in younger learners.

Through our Year 7 Program, we offer a daily routine that engages students in different modes of learning at the times of the day that those modes are most likely to be effective.

Our Year 7 classes are encouraged to learn in the ways they learn best, building confidence and capacity for self-guided learning into Year 8 and beyond.

Strong Relationships: Co-Location, Community and Connection

One of the keys to our success in Year 7 is our ability to help students build strong relationships, a sense of belonging and a feeling of being connected to our community at Faith.

By co-locating our Year 7 students and their classes in a dedicated space – a space which can be opened out into a number of flexible learning areas – we allow our Year 7 cohorts to build relationships not just within class groups, but across their entire year level, creating a sense of community, belonging and security from their very first day.

The forming of community and comfort through belonging also underpins our Year 7 camp, which usually occurs within the first two weeks of the new school year. By providing an opportunity for all our youngest learners to spend time with our teachers and with each other, away from a school setting, our Year 7 students can focus on building positive and affirmational relationships that set up a strong social and emotional foundation for learning across their first year of Secondary school life.



Empowering and equipping younger learners to find their identity as individuals, as members of our school community and as young citizens of the world.

During the Middle Years of education, relationships and belonging become a core aspect of each student's development.

Our Middle Years program provides a curriculum with opportunities and activities specifically tailored for early adolescents; supporting younger learners as they navigate an important transitional stage in their lives.

Through Years 7-9, students often experience a period of rapid and considerable change, wherein relationships and belonging become a core aspect of their development.

Relationships, belonging and the formation of identity are among the key components that define this period of growth, learning and development.

At Faith Lutheran College, particular care and attention is given to providing our Middle Years students with the support, encouragement, skills and knowledge they need in order to navigate these formative years of Secondary education, and emerge with a strong foundation and well-established support network as they enter their final years of schooling.

Our Middle Years Philosophy

Catering for the needs of each learner through the twin lenses of academic support and pastoral care, our focus places student support at the centre of our educational practice, providing teaching and learning which is characterised by:

ATAR and University Pathways

Our College has a strong history of producing university-ready graduates, and a reputation for maintaining a high academic standard amongst our ATAR pathway students.

Offering a broad range of subjects at both Year 11 and Year 12 level, our curriculum supports choice from both General and Applied subject streams, as well as the opportunity to obtain Certificate-level qualifications that enable students to qualify for early admission or guaranteed places in University programs.

Due to the extensive range of subjects on offer, our Senior students are often able to study a combination of subjects that reflect their personal interests and passions, while ensuring they are meeting the requirements necessary for entry into University, TAFE or other tertiary study.



Faith Lutheran College is a welcoming and inclusive community where the wellbeing of students, and care for our families, is fundamental to life and learning.

Our goal is to promote environments and opportunities that produce happy, healthy and active students, who engage positively with learning as they move through to the completion of their Secondary education.

At Faith, our students are at the heart of everything we do. We understand that effective teaching requires more than classrooms and textbooks - it requires happy and healthy students, who are encouraged to develop a passion for learning.

We believe that education, while primarily concerned with the expansion of knowledge, intellect and skills, needs to be holistic and take into account the development of the whole learner, including their social, intellectual, spiritual, cultural, physical and emotional needs.

Holistic Education

Our commitment to holistic education extends well outside of the classroom walls, with opportunities for students to engage in a wide range of activities including competitive and social sport, music, visual and performing arts, camps, excursions, on-campus events, dance, coding and information technology.

We also offer a substantial formal support and pastoral care network, with on-campus access to initial counselling services, student advocates, learning coaches, healthcare professionals and our College Pastor.

Innovative Timetable

Through our innovative timetable, each student at Faith studies six subjects; with all students receiving contact time with each of their teachers, in each subject area, each day - except Wednesday.

This promotes a consistency and fluency in learning that leads to improved engagement, higher academic results, and a reduced assessment load, allowing students to concentrate their best efforts on work that is key to their academic success. Our timetable also provides an important support structure that allows all students to receive frequent coaching and feedback from teaching and learning staff.

In addition to increasing the frequency of feedback, daily engagement with each subject aids in the progressive building of knowledge, helping to shorten the learning curve when engaging with new or previously unexplored topics, and greatly improving the ability of students to apply what they have learned - a quality that is essential for lifelong learning.



Each week we set aside a whole day for staff and students to focus on life and learning outside of the classroom. This includes worship, sessions with learning coaches, opportunities to participate in health and physical fitness activities and, most notably, opportunities to engage in Personal Project Time - a student-directed period of learning which allows each student to engage in passion-based projects that stretch beyond the core curriculum.

Through our Wednesday Program, each student at Faith is provided with time, resources and the ability to engage in learning that is guided by their own interest, curiosity and personal preferences. By breaking up the week and allowing formal time for students to invest in their own health, wellbeing and individual educational goals, we encourage energised, engaged and excited learners across more traditional classroom and curriculum based learning times, promoting greater learning outcomes for each student.



Proud of its Lutheran ethos, Faith's central message is that of the Gospel; the good news that our acceptance by God does not depend on our own worth or achievements but on His unconditional commitment to us as evidenced in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus.

Each day, we provide an opportunity for students to live, grow, learn and enjoy community together under the promise of the Gospel — assured of the knowledge that they are unique, deliberate and wonderful Children of God.

As followers of Christ and his example, Faith Lutheran College welcomes all families, no matter their personal or religious background.

Our Christian ethos underpins everything that happens within the Faith community, and we are committed to providing an environment of tolerance and grace, as each student develops their own unique gifts and talents.

Pastoral Care

Our commitment to demonstrating God's love to each other in both word and action means that all students are cared for, supported and valued. These characteristics are both present and visible in all that we do.

Our School Pastor works to support and care for our entire school community – staff, students and families. Aided by a dedicated team including a registered nurse, Heads of Learning Community for each of our four Houses (HOLCHs), a guidance counsellor and a careers counsellor, Faith is proud of it's ability to offer genuine support, assistance and pastoral care to each and every learner.

Restorative Practices

As an extension of the grace and forgiveness shown to us by God, we view negative interactions as an opportunity to learn, and focus on solutions that allow harm to be repaired through a process that treats all parties involved with fairness and respect.

Our Restorative Practices approach to negative incidences:

- Creates an opportunity to discuss incidents openly and honestly.
- Provides an opportunity for the victim and wrongdoer to express their views.
- Provides a way of looking at poor choices and actions that focusses on both support and accountability Law and Gospel.
- Is about healing and mending relationships rather than punishing and shaming individuals.
- Focusses on the development of well-rounded young people that are capable of taking responsibility for their actions and choices.

We take great pride in adopting this approach with our students, and believe it is a cornerstone of the safe, welcoming and inclusive environment we are able to offer at Faith Lutheran College.

Each Faith-operated bus route runs daily, following a schedule to collect students who have requested the use of a bus service.



Education for Students with Additional Needs:

Learning Support and Enrichment Team

At Faith, we recognise the right of all students to have equitable access to our curriculum.

We employ a dedicated Learning Enrichment team; assisting us to offer a range of differentiated educational programs to cater for the specific needs of individual students.

The diversity of all students is valued at Faith, including those who have additional learning needs. Our aim is to develop the whole person for life's journey, understanding that the journey looks different for each and every student.

Where possible, our philosophy is to offer tailored support to students with specific learning needs. This may include providing specialised learning plans for students with:

Physical, cognitive and sensory disabilities

Learning Enrichment Team

Our specialised Learning Enrichment Team supports students with additional learning needs to maximise learning opportunities.

Principal will issue a formal Letter of Offer, as well
as an Enrolment Contract and some additional
forms that must be completed and returned to
the College in order to finalise the enrolment.


