

Who We Are

We are an inter-denominational, co-educational day school, located in beautiful Toowoomba, which caters for students from Kindergarten to Year 6.

We are a friendly and welcoming school that seeks to provide a Christ-centred education for our students which is grounded in biblical values and the promotion of a positive and engaging learning environment for all students.



Our Mission Statement

Our History

The Toowoomba Christian Parent Controlled Day School Association Inc. (Qld) was instituted in 1991. Since it was formed, the Association has worked to develop a school which provides children in Toowoomba with an education that is based on God's infallible Word, and which is an extension of the Christian home.



Originally, most of the parents involved with the Association already had children in various church schools. Feedback from these schools indicated that the pressure of enrolments and waiting lists suggested it was a good time to look at beginning another Christian school in Toowoomba. The Board believed that because of the direction in which Toowoomba was developing, it would be best to establish such a school on the western edge of the city, namely Glenvale.

In 1993, the Association was successful in receiving provisional approval from the Commonwealth Government for funding for a new school. However, this offer lapsed as the school did not commence at this time. In 1996, the Association was successful in receiving approval from the Toowoomba City Council to begin Glenvale Christian School in 1997. Application for Commonwealth Funding was again made, and was successful.

current location. By God's grace, the school continued to grow, and so plans were made to find a permanent location for GCS. After much hard work and dedication by the incumbent board, parents and association members, the school purchased its current site on 19th October 2001.

The school continued to expand, and in March 2003 the first works began on site. Over the ensuing years, the school has grown considerably from its humble beginnings of a single de-mountable classroom block to what can be seen today.

Characteristics of our Student Body

The majority of students at Glenvale Christian School come from Protestant Christian families. Most families have English as their first language, and the majority have working parents. A large percentage of families have more than one child, sometimes from blended families.

In 2019, around 60% of our families attended church, 3% of our students are Indigenous, 1% hold overseas visas and 6% speak a language other than English at home.

Social Climate

At Glenvale Christian School, we work with parents to equip our students to be successful in life, both now and in the future, through teaching in the academic, social, emotional and spiritual domains. We have developed our behaviour management procedures around six core Biblical values. Through these values, we are able to not only shape Godly behaviour but provide an understanding of why these values are important.

When supporting students who have learning, emotional or behavioural needs, we appreciate the wisdom and support of parents and work to develop a team approach. Partnership with parents allows us to provide a consistent approach to dealing with

issues. We have a chaplain who works one day a week and is included in support plans for students as needed.

As part of our school improvement plan, we have looked at how to best engage students in their learning and help teachers meet the individual needs of students. The School Improvement Plan has been focused on student assessment data, setting clear learning goals and providing feedback on student achievement. Teachers provide Term Curriculum Summaries to parents, which allowed parents to be informed and included in the academic development of their child.

Distinctive Curriculum Offerings

As well as offering all the Key Learning Areas, Glenvale Christian School offers:

- Biblical Studies We are reading through the Bible over three years as a school.
- Music and Art taught by a specialist teacher.
- HPE taught by a specialist teacher
- Two weeks learn to swim program
- LOTE Sign (AUSLAN) Prep to Year 2 and German for Years 3-7
- An annual camp for Years 5-6



Value Added Activities & Parent Partnership

Parental Involvement

We involve parents in the following areas:

- A clear explanation of homework requirement so parents can be involved.
- Prep concerts and end of term programs to allow parents to see what children have achieved.
- Staff available before and after school to speak to parents.
- Communication booklets or diaries in most classrooms.
- Interim reports and interviews in Term 1 to keep parents informed of children's progress.
- Parent curriculum afternoons Terms 1-3.
- Helping in classrooms in areas such as exchanging home readers, helping small groups and gardening.
- Regular newsletters about what will be learnt that week in a number of classrooms.
- Report positive behaviours to parents on a weekly basis in a number of classrooms.
- Present Archer Awards on school assembly to promote and encourage positive behaviour.
- Working bees

Parent, Teacher and Student Satisfaction

New Enrolments

During enrolment interviews, prospective parents are asked if the school has been recommended to them by other current parents. In many instances, the main reason for new parents to make inquiries at GCS has been from positive word of mouth recommendations from current parents.

Teacher Retention

Individual professional interviews were conducted in January 2019 with all staff; teachers, teacher aides and office staff. These interviews demonstrated 100% positive expectation to continue working at GCS, with many anecdotal references made regarding staff dedication to the school.

Parent & Student Satisfaction Feedback

The end of year Year 6 Graduation dinner was an opportunity for students and parents to express satisfaction as the Year 6 students completed their primary education at GCS.

Enrolment Growth

During the last six years, there has been steady and considerable growth in the student population.

2012 - 88 students

2017 - 109 students

2019 - 119 students



Staff

All teachers at Glenvale Christian School are registered with the Queensland College of Teachers and have teaching qualifications from an accredited higher education authority.

Staff Composition, Including Indigenous Staff

In 2019, Glenvale Christian School had a total of 20 staff members. These consisted of staff in the following areas: executive, full-time and part-time classroom teaching; teacher aides, administration; part-time chaplain; IT manager, cleaning and grounds, Kindergarten Centre and instrumental Music Tutors. There are currently no indigenous staff.
