

PRE-SCHOOL


We believe that children learn best through play and so at our Pre-School we plan activities that tap into the natural curiosity of young children. Our teachers design programs that foster social skills and physical and cognitive development. As the Pre-School is located within the Primary School, our children are prepared for a smooth transition to formal schooling. Our partnership with parents also starts here—an essential and ongoing aspect of an education at Arden.

PRIMARY

As the Arden learner starts the more formal part of his or her education, our teachers differentiate the curriculum as they seek to meet the needs of each student. We also begin to formally track individual academic progress. Our classroom teachers are supported by specialist teachers who work with the children in areas such as sport, music, Mandarin, French and technology.

Learning at Arden extends beyond covering core curriculum content to encouraging the development of values, attitudes and habits towards learning: from Kindergarten we introduce our students to Habits of Mind, with an aim to foster resilience, critical and creative thinking. We also use the Gallup Student Poll® from Year 5 to actively track student hope, wellbeing and engagement. It is from solid foundations that independent learners can flourish.





MIDDLE SCHOOL

Middle School at Arden (from Year 7 to 9) represents a significant shift in a student's journey. In these years we look to build strong social and academic foundations by helping our students develop the skills they need to become independent, life long learners. These include an emphasis on deep thinking, creative and collaborative learning, and study skills.

As our students move towards increased independence they also discover more about who they are and where their strengths and interests lie. Therefore we offer a diverse range of subject electives and co-curricular activities. Our teachers develop a safe environment within the classroom, where young students feel empowered to take risks when presented with appropriate challenges.



SENIOR SCHOOL

Our Senior School prepares and equips our students so they can grow as autonomous and collaborative learners in preparation for tertiary studies, work and service in the local and global community.

We offer a wide choice of subject areas (including partner programs with Macquarie University) and the opportunity to specialise. Students learn in the focused, academic environment of our Senior Study Centre.

Arden has a well deserved reputation for achieving solid Higher School Certificate results. Our HSC students consistently report that their dedicated teachers played a critical role in their success, highlighting not just the professionalism and expertise of their teachers but also the genuine care they experienced.







Arden is bursting with co-curricular programs and we encourage all students to actively participate. Our co-curricular activities include sport, music, drama, dance, public speaking, outdoor education, community service and overseas tours. We believe co-curricular opportunities enrich the overall learning process, support the development of the whole child, build relationships across the school, and also allow those children with gifts and talents to excel.







In our Primary School we offer a wide range of co-curricular activities.

Our outdoor education camps are carefully designed to allow children to experience appropriate physical, social and emotional challenges within a safe and caring environment. Our Primary School community service initiatives aim to develop a sense of joy towards giving and serving.

We also encourage participation in sport because we know that it contributes to physical, mental and social health and wellbeing.

Co-curricular opportunities broaden in our Secondary School as students refine their skills and interests. We have a history of excellence in many of these areas. Our music ensembles include vocal, jazz, wind and string, and students enjoy many performance opportunities, including regional and international music tours. Our dance groups compete at eisteddfods throughout the year and perform at a variety of school and community functions. Our Theatresports drama program is also a very popular co-curricular activity for students in Year 7 to 12.

We also have an enviable sporting record, with many of our students regularly representing Arden at Combined Independent Schools or State level in many sports. Each year group, before Year 12, has a unique outdoor education camp experience, which includes the Duke of Edinburgh scheme.

We offer our Secondary students the opportunity to travel, providing opportunities for personal growth and also experiential learning that reinforces the academic curriculum. There are also a number of leadership opportunities where students can serve as prefects, leaders of our social justice groups, public speaking and debating teams, tech crew or peer support groups. At Arden we have a particular emphasis on community service: a practical application of the Christian message. Our overseas mission tours give our Year 11 students an opportunity to demonstrate compassionate and courageous service to others.

Throughout the Arden learning journey there is a deliberate focus on preparing our students for life after school and we have developed a number of programs that enable us to achieve this.

From Year 5 onwards we help our students identify their natural talents through our Strengths program. Each year we participate in the Gallup Student Poll® because we know there is a strong link between students who are hopeful, engaged and thriving and future academic and employment success.

We offer a multitude of leadership opportunities to help our students learn to become service-minded leaders. Our tailored careers education program carefully and effectively prepares our students for a positive post-school transition. Beginning in Year 9 we offer careers profiling, subject selection counselling, a structured work experience program and a number of careers education seminars.

We help our students explore options such as university or TAFE, an industry cadetship, apprenticeship and/ or traineeship as well as international exchanges or gap programs. Our partner programs with universities also give our students access to preferred admissions schemes, scholarships and prizes.

1 ENQUIRY

Initial enquiries are directed to the Registrar for an information pack or to sign up to attend an Open Morning.

2 OPEN MORNING/TOUR

All prospective families are encouraged to visit either the Primary or Secondary School for an Open Morning or Tour.

3 Application

be submitted to the
Registrar to secure a
position on the School's
waiting list. The form
must be accompanied
by relevant
documentation
and the Enrolment
Application Fee.

4 WAITING LIST

Once this information is received and processed, the child is placed on the waiting list.

5 INTERVIEW

Prospective families and students will be invited to attend an interview with the appropriate Head of School and undertake any appropriate standardised testing.

6 Offer of a place

Once it has been determined that a place exists in a year group and any relevant support or enrichment programs, prospective students are formally offered a place. Parents are asked to confirm acceptance of that place by paying the non-refundable Confirmation Fee and signing the Conditions of Enrolment.

7 ORIENTATION

Orientation events are held regularly towards the end of each year prior to entry, or when the opportunity allows for mid-year intakes.
