Academic excellence

Our students consistently perform well above State and National averages in all age groups and learning areas. In recent years, well over 30 percent of our graduates have earned ATAR scores within the top 10 percent of Western Australia and well over 50 percent of students have achieved in the top 20 percent. Most students go on to enter university courses of their choice with Engineering, Medicine, Commerce and Teaching being amonst the most popular.

Positive study culture

Secondary students benefit from free after school tuition in the core subjects of Maths, English, Science and Humanities and Social Sciences (HASS). Many students participate in this programme, creating a positive study culture where academic excellence is supported and celebrated.

Spiritual and emotional wellbeing

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

Significantly, our results also show that individual students demonstrate excellent progress and improvement throughout their learning journey.

We work closely with every child to determine personalised learning plans that allow students to set, strive for and accomplish personal goals. Continuous and regular assessment practises allow us to carefully monitor the progress of individual students.

Extension / Acceleration

Kingsway's Extension Programme provides students who are outstanding academically, the opportunity and flexibility to accelerate in a particular discipline. This has been operating with excellent outcomes for a number of years and has provided students with acceleration in a specific subject (e.g. reading or maths), and at times it has also provided global acceleration where necessary. We are proud of the way the College has been able to provide a flexible approach to meet the needs of students who have outstanding academic gifts. Free after school tuition is offered to Secondary school students in the core subjects of Maths, English Science and HASS.

Gifted and Talented Programme (GATE)

The GATE programme commences from Year 5. Students who are identified as 'gifted & talented' have diverse skills and talents and are not necessarily bright academically, and/or may not be achieving outstanding academic results. These students are typically excellent problem solvers, or have exhibited highly developed lateral thinking processes. Once identified, these students are provided with collaborative, enquiry based and real life project based learning, where they have greater ownership and control in their learning, working in groups with like-minded peers.

30 - 40% of Kingsway Christian College students consistently place in the top 10% of ATAR scores in Western Australia.

Early Learning

Children in Kindergarten to Year 2 enjoy a developmentally appropriate programme in a vibrant and energetic environment where play-based learning techniques form a vital part of an experiential learning journey. There is a strong focus on developing literacy and numeracy skills as well as cognitive, language, physical, emotional, social and motor skills.

Primary School

The primary years of schooling form the foundation of a child's education journey. During these critical formative years, children learn best in a nurturing and caring environment. We challenge students to pursue excellence by setting achievable goals in the context of a safe, Christian environment. In addition to learning the core subjects; English, Mathematics, Science and Humanities and Social Sciences (HASS). Students can also begin to explore their personal interests through a broad range of co-curricular programmes in Art, Drama, Music, Sport, Technology and Language.

Secondary School

We offer a comprehensive academic and co-curricular programme to allow students to pursue a broad range of both tertiary and vocational pathways. Our curriculum is designed to stimulate and challenge students. Students gain an understanding of numeracy and literacy through the study of core subjects including English, Mathematics, Science and HASS. In addition, all students participate in a Christian Life Studies Course and have the opportunity to engage in the Arts, Technology and Enterprise, Health and Physical Education and Languages. Students are taught critical thinking skills which can be applied in any context.

Technology

Technology is used in the classroom to enhance learning experiences and to make education relevant and engaging. Students in Years 5 to 12 participate in the College's One-to-One programme, where a specified device can be used to complement their learning.

SPORT

Sport is an important part of a well-balanced learning and development programme. Our Workplace Learning programme for Secondary students addresses important life issues such as career choices, self-esteem, respect for others and their rights, ethical decision making and work placement advice.

PASTORAL CARE

A Kingsway Christian College education is a partnership between the home, school and the Christian community. This partnership provides a lifeline of support to our students. It is imperative that our students can feel safe and valued.

Teachers, Chaplains, Heads of Students, support staff and even student leaders all play a vital role to create a vibrant and supportive community spirit. Pastoral care is pivotal to what we do. Our structured support network ensures the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care.

Support network

Pastoral care is a key strength of our College, with parents regularly providing encouraging feedback. However, all students are encouraged to look out for one another. The caring attitude of our students is a source of great pride.

The College has a strong culture of mentorship, with older students looking out for younger children. Primary students participate in a Buddy programme. Year 10 students mentor Year 7 students as they transition to Secondary School.

Protective Behaviours Curriculum

The College delivers a Protective Behaviours Curriculum to all students from Kindergarten to Year 12. The purpose of the programme is to create a safe learning environment and educate children about social and emotional wellbeing. The curriculum is based on the child safe organisation framework which includes the nine domains:

- 3. Involving family and community
- 4. Child safe and friendly policies
- 5. Managing staff and volunteers
- 6. Safe environments physical and online
- 7. Child friendly complaint process and reporting

The programme helps children to identify feelings, act responsibily and safely, and navigate bullying issues to ensure all students can feel safe at all times.

Admission policy

Our College has a strong Christian ethos where there is synergy between the Christian values of families, the Church and the School.
