Our history


La Salle College was founded by the Lasallian Order in 1954, but our legacy in the Swan Valley dates back to the community of the local Midland parishes in the early 1900s.



Our facilities

Our wonderful facilities and generous outdoor spaces provide an innovative and modern learning environment that inspires our students to explore their potential both within and beyond the classroom.

Our campus is situated in the beautiful Swan Valley region and is easily accessible by public transport. We are proud of our large natural spaces, state of the art buildings and modern learning spaces.





Br Fitzhardinge Trade Skills Centre

Comprising state of the art facilities in the form of three workshops and multiple classrooms, the Br Fitzhardinge Trade Skills Centre offers students the opportunity to develop practical trade skills through our extensive range of Technologies courses.

St John Baptist de La Salle Chapel

Our onsite Chapel provides opportunities for our College community to come together in prayers and worship. Along with the Chapel, the adjacent Memorial Garden offers a quiet place of reflection.

Jan Jolley iCentre

Our learning and teaching systems are enhanced by our Jan Jolley iCentre.

More than a library, the iCentre provides both students and teachers with extensive access to quality on-site and online resources. From monitors and meeting rooms, to books, magazines and online streaming subscriptions, the space and facilities of the iCentre equips students with tools to continuously explore their full potential.

Outdoor spaces

The College has generous outdoor open spaces to facilitate our extensive Health and Physical Education program and inter-school sport activities.

A front oval with football goals, cricket nets and cricket pitch and a back oval with soccer goals and multi-purpose courts (basketball, netball and tennis). Hosts a range of sports including soccer, AFL, ultimate frisbee, cricket and touch rugby.



St Joseph Education Support Centre

Our St Joseph Education Support Centre is one of the largest in Western Australia. Café de La Salle runs once a week. The Centre also features rooms to support tailored learning.

Our pastoral care



A Lasallian school is more than just a curriculum, it's a united community connected in values, in spirit and a common experience. From your initial interaction with our College, we aspire to make you feel welcomed and valued as part of our community.

A sense of belonging

Our Year 7 transition program, which includes orientation, offers students the support and foundation to have a positive high school transition and college experience.

Our College House systems create opportunities for students to participate in activities and connect with students across all year groups, often taking part in team building and sporting activities together at carnivals and school events.

Pastoral Care Groups

Our Pastoral Care Groups (PCGs) come together briefly each morning to receive news and updates. These groups are particularly important in Year 7, to create safe and reliable environments within which students can develop friendships and receive support from staff and peers.

A focus on wellbeing

We create and foster an inclusive, safe and supportive learning environment that enables students to flourish. As a College, we nurture the development of our students' spiritual, physical and mental wellbeing.

Our College Wellbeing Program aims to develop each student holistically. The program is presented and discussed in the context of our Catholic values and beliefs. Our Student Wellbeing Program incorporates elements of Protective Behaviour Education.

Our wellbeing activities are a combination of specific programs presented to each year level group by teaching staff, counselling team members and external presenters. The focus is on building students' intra and interpersonal skills, developing growth mindsets, coping strategies, building resilience, and social conflict / social problem-solving skills.

A supportive environment

We appreciate and celebrate the individuality of each student, relishing our role of assisting them to navigate obstacles and enabling them to discover and achieve their full potential.

We have a range of inclusive and accessible support systems and learning programs in place. These are designed to cater to students' individual needs and assist them to realise the value of their college experience while instilling the necessary tools to have an enriching life.



Our learning pathways

At La Salle College we offer a diverse and challenging curriculum to cater for the needs and interests of all students. As life-long learners ourselves, we continually look to adapt the learning opportunities for our young people to meet their contemporary needs and interests.

Academic overview

La Salle College provides extensive choice and opportunities for young people in courses leading to achievement of the Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE), TAFE entrance, university entrance or securing employment. Our dynamic learning environment ensures students are offered a range of academic pathways tailored to help them achieve excellence at an individual level. As a Catholic school, Religious Education is our first learning area and is studied by every student from Year 7 to 12. To complement classroom learning the College also offers a range of extracurricular activities.

Year 7

Opportunities are centred around igniting their passions and exploring natural curiosities by showing them where to look; yet letting their critical and creative brains determine what they see.

Year 8

Building on the progress made in their first year the curriculum becomes more challenging, and students are placed into pathways that matches their ability in subjects such as English and Mathematics.

Year 9

Choices are tailored to both individual interests – and the link to future pathways and courses on offer in Year 10 to 12. Subjects available for students include Electronics, Sport Science, Physical Recreation, Outdoor Education, Childcare and Development, Textiles and Fashion and Music.

Year 10

Shaping their own personal pathway for learning through consultation and advice from their subject teachers. Courses are offered at a foundation, general or extension level in subjects such as English, Mathematics and Science as our lens for learning is shaped by the upcoming pathway choices in Year 11 and 12.



University pathways

ATAR

Students are provided with a variety of Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) pathways to seek entry to their university of choice. Upon completion of Year 12, students are given a calculated score based only on their Year 12 results, which is then used for university entrance applications. Students who choose the direct ATAR pathway are offered priority positions in courses of study ahead of those who seek entrance through the alternate pathway.

Murdoch Flexi-Track

A student who has the academic capacity to succeed at university but needs extra support in some areas can choose to participate in Murdoch Flexi-Track. This pathway is offered in partnership with Murdoch University and enables students to complete this university endorsed course as part of their Year 12 studies. Students who successfully complete this course will be given direct entry to any Murdoch University course, excluding Nursing, indicative of an ATAR score of 70.

Alternate pathway

A student who has the academic capacity to succeed at university but needs extra support can follow the alternate-entrance pathway. This pathway provides the opportunity for students to apply to courses from a range of universities following the completion of Year 12 where they have chosen general subjects along with English ATAR.

Education Support

Our program is one of the largest in Western Australia and our St Joseph Education Support Centre features a range of rooms that supports tailored learning. Students are provided with the opportunity to develop work-ready skills such as barista skills and business administration experience through Café de La Salle which runs once a week.

Skill-based and Workplace Learning

Skill-based programs provide students the opportunity to explore their interest in purposeful skills. At La Salle College, our food technologies, metalwork, woodwork, robotics and technical graphic design studies give students practical skills for post-school professions.

As part of our ONSITE and Vocational Education and Training (VET) programs, students can build their knowledge and experience while gaining valuable insight into industry.

Our partnerships with TAFEs, local businesses and other providers ensure our students can further their learning in a workplace setting and achieve accreditations, opening doors to higher learning and career opportunities.





Music and Arts

Our Music and Arts programs allow our students to develop their gifts and abilities to their full potential. La Salle College has a creative curriculum and after school opportunities across music, dance, drama and art programs. Through concerts, performances and exhibitions, students are given the opportunity and confidence to showcase their talent.

Every student can participate in our extensive curricular and co-curricular sporting program including but not limited to AFL, athletics, cross-country, netball, orienteering, soccer, swimming and volleyball. Central to this is the College's involvement in the Associated and Catholic Colleges of WA (ACC) program which includes Swimming, Athletics and Cross-Country carnivals and Inclusive Sports Program.
