St Stephen's School is a young and progressive co-educational school of the Uniting Church in Australia, built on a mission to inspire learning that transforms and empowers lives.

The School was established at the Duncraig campus in 1984 on the corner of the Mitchell Freeway and Hepburn Avenue. It is home to a Primary School for Years 3 to 6 and a Secondary School for Years 7 to 12. In 2011, an Early Learning Centre for Pre-Kindergarten to Year 2 opened in Padbury, across Hepburn Avenue; it's close proximity and access sees it considered part of the Duncraig campus.

The Carramar campus was opened in 2001 on St Stephen's Crescent, off Joondalup Drive. It houses a Primary School for Pre-Kindergarten to Year 6, and a Secondary School for Years 7 to 12. Buses run daily from the Duncraig campus to the Carramar campus, stopping at various points including the Currambine Train Station.

We believe our high-quality teaching staff are the best resource we have and invest in their development through the St Stephen's Institute. Our Graduate teacher program sees graduate teachers individually mentored by experienced St Stephen's School teachers who pass on their experience and knowledge, which is just one reason the School is seen as an Employer of Choice with a high rate of engagement and retention of staff.

Each campus has a range of facilities including contemporary libraries, digital learning hubs, gymnasiums, a theatre, dance and art studios, music rooms, sporting grounds, nature play spaces, 'chill-out' zones and more, creating a home away from home.

The School also owns a 100-acre Outdoor Education property at Dwellingup, adjacent to Lane Poole Reserve. Known as The Kaadadjan Centre, the property has extensive areas of native forest, more than 800m of Murray River frontage and neighbours the Bibbulmun Track and Munda Biddi Trail, making it a fantastic retreat for students and staff to learn from and connect with nature.

St Stephen's fosters education that is flexible, personalised and engaging. Students are connected via an intricate digital ICT structure that promotes learning anywhere, anytime. The School promotes a Many2One program, where students in Years 5-12 can choose which device best facilitates their learning.

The School has built a series of highly-regarded Service Learning programs which see staff and students regularly assisting those in need. This stems from simple actions such as passing on technological expertise to the elderly to building facilities and new structures for underprivileged communities in a number of countries around the world.

THE SCHOOL CREST

THE KAADADJAN CENTRE

Outdoor Education is a great way for children to foster an understanding of the environment and their role in its future.

St Stephen's School owns a 100-acre Outdoor Education Rural Property at Dwellingup, adjacent to Lane Poole Reserve. The property has extensive areas of native forest, more than 800m of Murray River frontage and neighbours the Bibbulmun Track and Munda Biddi Trail.

The property has a rich history dating back to the 1800s, filled with tales of pastoralists, tree mills and family fortunes.

It provides a fantastic opportunity for our community to immerse themselves in the outdoors.

HOUSES

An interdisciplinary House system signifies a sense of belonging and community. Students are allocated to a House upon enrolment and remain in the same House throughout their schooling.

The House system was established to assist with the wellbeing of our students through a structure that facilitates encouragement, counsel and wellbeing.

Each House is led by a Dean, Assistant Dean and student House leaders. In Secondary School, the students report to a homeroom in their House building. The homerooms, with the exception of Year 7, are multi-age, thus, providing extensive mentoring and leadership opportunities in a safe and nurturing environment.

FAITH


CARE

Care is what characterises our community. At St Stephen's School, every student is valued and supported so that they feel a sense of belonging.

The School provides a safe environment in which caring relationships can be modelled and encouraged. We strive to ensure your children will feel happy, safe and cared for, empowering them to be the best they can.

St Stephen's School is committed to providing significant care to each student in social, educational and personal matters. This is facilitated through our unique care structure where:

- Our team of highly-qualified School Psychologists are an invaluable resource for parents, families and students, with members based at each campus and in both primary and secondary schools.
- A Deputy of Care in each school is dedicated to the wellbeing of students. Each of these leaders are a support for students.
- Each campus has a fully-trained nurse onsite to ensure students' safety, health and wellbeing.
- Students are allocated into a House upon enrolment, fostering a sense of belonging and community.
- Each House is led by a Dean, Assistant Dean and student House leaders who are available to encourage and counsel our community.
- Primary School students are supported by selected Secondary School students through the 'Pri-Mates' program, promoting confidence and resilience in our younger students and leadership skills in the older cohort.



SERVICE

St Stephen's believes a commitment to the wellbeing of others develops mature, independent and caring people.

Our students, teachers and staff are challenged to think about, and then act upon, things they can do to change the world, no matter how large or small.

This is reflected in our School motto Serve God, Serve One Another, where students give their time, effort and resources to support those who are less fortunate than themselves.

Service Learning occurs in various ways. Students can volunteer either individually, in year groups or as a homeroom. Our network of government and community groups at the local, national and international level provide St Stephen's School with many opportunities to serve.

Some of our most recent Service Learning initiatives include:

- St Stephen's School was chosen by Western Australia Charity Direct as a pilot school to launch the next 'generation of philanthropists' through education, support, and inspiration guided by WACD's Ambassador and Captain of the Perth Wildcats Damian Martin.
- St Stephen's School's Food Rescue cart sees staff and students visit cafes and restaurants to

collect unused food to donate to services that help people in need in partnership with UnitingCare West Food Rescue.

- Regular visits to local art centres for the disabled, teaching elderly people how to use new technologies and providing music and entertainment for community events.
- An annual visit to Bethany Home in Malaysia, a school and training centre for disabled children and adults, where a group of students commit themselves to serving as teachers' helpers at the school.
- The collection of food, gifts and raising of funds for UnitingCare West's Christmas Appeal and operation Christmas Child, which involves sending a message of hope to children in desperate situations in the form of Christian literature and a gift-filled box at Christmas time.
- The School's St Stephen's Global tours focus on Asia, Africa and Australia and involve hands-on service tasks that build character, empathy and engagement amongst our students. The tours also contribute in a practical way to the welfare of the local people.
- Partnerships with two remote East Kimberley Aboriginal Schools immerse students in culture and encourage knowledge sharing and friendships.

ST STEPHEN'S SCHOOL SERVICE LEARNING

Our School's dedication to the service value includes local volunteering opportunities where our community assist those less fortunate, to global service tours that have seen St Stephen's students and staff building new homes for impoverished families in Cambodia, undertaking maintenance for villages in the Himalayan region of India and visiting Indigenous Schools closer to home, in remote areas of the Kimberley.

In addition to the numerous local service opportunities our community take part in on a regular basis, some of the service tour opportunities our students can participate in include:

- Service Tours to two Indigenous Schools Yiyili and Purnululu – in The Kimberley, including the Year 9/10 Lou Morrison Kimberley Service Tour and the Year 6 Kimberley Service Tour
- Year 12 India Service Tour to Woodstock School and surrounding villages

PRIMARY SCHOOL

Primary school years are an important time for establishing firm foundations for your child's life; academically, socially and spiritually.

Our primary schooling caters to the social and emotional needs of children in their early years (Pre-Kindergarten-Year 2) and the developmental requirements of those in Years 3-6.

A play-based approach appeals to the natural curiosities of younger children, giving them the best start for a life filled with creativity, learning and growth. Primary students are consistently challenged through the inquiry-based approach where they can discover their niche and potential.

The Primary School is committed to developing students who are motivated, resilient, confident and caring.

The adventure of learning goes beyond the primary classroom with a range of camps from Years 1-6 and a rich excursion schedule.

Our physical education program offers all the standard school sports including basketball, soccer, tennis, AFL and netball, plus specialised programs including swimming, surfing, athletics and cross-country. Primary students also take part in Interhouse and Interschool carnivals.

Diverse arts programs provide a range of opportunities for the more artistically-inclined to perfect their skills beyond the standard curriculum with drama performances and musicals, orchestral concerts, choirs and bands, art and media exhibitions, competitions and private tuition.
