Principal's Message

Welcome to the Hawthorn Secondary College community.

The past 3 years have seen a range of significant improvements to the facilities and learning programs at the College, many of which are highlighted throughout this brochure. Education Department data on the College shows that what happens in our classrooms - and beyond - are making significant differences to our student outcomes.

We have the right climate in place to foster strong educational performance, which is one of the reasons why our tertiary access rate for the past two years has been 25% higher than the state average. It is particularly pleasing to see that 98% of our students continue their educational studies at either University or TAFE.

Additionally, growth in student learning (based on the annual NAPLAN testing results) is now consistently exceeding the state mean.

In recent research studies conducted amongst Hawthorn Secondary College students and parents, the College was rated significantly higher above the mean scores of all schools in Victoria with Year 7 to Year 12 students in all 11 of the categories measured. In fact, in the student survey Hawthorn Secondary College ranked in the top 25% of all schools in every category.

Additionally, Hawthorn Secondary College was ranked in the top 25% category by parents on the following criteria:



The results and achievements of the College's alumni are a testament to the school's programs and pathways, which provide each student with individual assistance as they transition from school to further education, training or employment.


Stellar VCE Results and High Tertiary Access Rates

Hawthorn Secondary College students have consistently achieved some of the best VCE results in Victoria, resulting in a 25% higher tertiary access rate than the state average.

Approximately 70% of graduating students carry on their education at University, while an additional 28% continue at TAFE.

The Middle Years – An Exciting Time of Development and Learning

The Middle Years Learning Centre is home to dynamic and innovative programs, with students working in flexible, open-plan space and accessing the very best in Information and Communications technology.

Year 7 Transition Program

All Year 7 students are supported with a comprehensive transition program comprising a Peer Support Program, an Orientation Camp and a specially designed pastoral program. With an emphasis on self discovery and building friendships, the program includes activities, learning experiences and guest speakers. This structured transition and orientation program assists students to move smoothly and confidently into the secondary school environment.

Years 7 and 8 - Building Breadth and Depth Students work with an integrated and inquiry based curriculum that values multiple intelligences and develops higher order thinking skills. Each semester a different inquiry topic is explored across all the





Years 9 and 10 - Developing Pathways

Civics and Citizenship beyond the classroom and into the community is an integral part of the learning experience in Years 9 and 10.

This includes a hands-on approach where students spend time with local elderly citizens through a Community Awareness program. These experiences are then told and presented through the medium of Digital Storytelling.

Additionally, in collaboration with the Victorian Arts Centre, Soundhouse, Year 9 students undertake a City Project in which they complete city-based fieldwork to produce a digital film that responds to a contemporary issue.

Year 10 students attend a one-week Civics focused tour of Canberra's historical and political institutions. They may also complete a structured work experience placement during the year and receive personalised careers counselling and services from the College Careers Manager.

Students in Year 10 are encouraged to take a VCE Unit 1 & 2 subject as an accelerated learning approach, which then lessens their course load in Year 12 and contributes to their ATAR.

Years 11-12 – Preparing for the Future



The College provides a diverse range of programs and pathways that recognise and meet the different needs and aspirations of students in the final two years of secondary school education.

Students can select from an array of different study options, including:

- a broad selection of VCE subjects
- Vocational Education and Training (VET) studies
- TAFE experiences and visits
- School Based Apprenticeships
- University Enhancement Subjects

Mentoring Approach

Year 11 and 12 students are given personalised support with the aim of maximising their performance and outcomes. Beginning with the negotiated development of Individual Learning Plans, this support includes study support, pastoral care, homework and planner checks, self organisation and goal setting, as well as a structured study schedule during term breaks.

A Year 12 Study Camp and guest speakers are features of the senior program.

Purpose Built Facilities

The tertiary-style VCE Learning Common area and adjacent classrooms have been designed to replicate the learning environment students will encounter at University and TAFE institutions.

Acceleration

Students enrolled in Year 10 are encouraged to undertake a VCE unit 1 & 2 and students in Year 11 a VCE unit 3 & 4. Studies offered: Literature, Media, Legal Studies, Maths Methods, Biology and VET.

Pathways

Over 70% of our students go on to university studies. Hawthorn Secondary College has a 25% higher tertiary access rate than the state average. A comprehensive range of courses covering Vocational Education Training, School Based Apprenticeships and Technical and Further Education can also be part of a Year 10 and VCE course.

Enhancing Classroom Lessons



Anywhere, Anytime Learning

All Year 7-8 students receive an Apple iPad as part of the College's innovative iPads for iDeas program.

Students in Years 9-12 each receive a fully loaded Netbook with Wi-Fi functionality, facilitating anywhere, anytime access to curriculum materials and class assignments.

These technology tools make learning at Hawthorn Secondary College highly interactive, engaging, personalised and well suited for today's technology literate students.

Life Skills Programs

Numerous Well Being Programs are in place at the College to help students deal with the complexities of transitioning into young adults. Some of these programs are:

"Keys Please"

As part of the schools' commitment to improving the road safety of young road users, the Keys Please information evening is run annually for students and their parents. The information sessions assist learner drivers and parents to improve their driving experience. Representatives from VicRoads and the Victorian Police speak to parents and students who are about to or have just gained their Learners Permit.

Reach Youth Day

Each year, students in Year 9 attend the Reach Youth Day. This is a day of self-discovery where participants are encouraged to realise their full potential. Around 500 young people from neighbouring schools are drawn together and guided through a day of interactive, experiential learning, drawing on powerful interactive experiences, real life heroes and popular culture.

Boroondara Young Leaders Program

Year 10 students are invited to participate in the Young Leaders Program conducted by the Boroondara Young People's Resource Centre. This week-long program involves young people from neighbouring schools and focuses on developing good leadership skills. The program culminates with an evening where students showcase what they have learnt to parents, friends and teachers. A certificate of participation is presented to students by the Mayor of Boroondara.

Community Partner Programs

Hawthorn Secondary College partners with major organisations in both the business and academic fields to provide unique learning and development opportunities for students. These include:

Monash University

The College has a strong partnership with Monash University, which raises the awareness of tertiary education options for students. Year 10, 11 and 12 students spend time at Monash University campuses, an experience that compliments the tertiary style learning environment of the VCE Learning Centre. This in turn assists in the transition from secondary to tertiary study, leaving students well placed to succeed.

Freehills Law Firm Mentoring Program

The long established partnership with Freehills Law Firm provides a unique mentoring initiative which has proven very successful in motivating and inspiring Year 9 students. Students travel fortnightly to Freehills city offices to meet their assigned mentor for lunch and an activity session which relates to the topic of that week.

Parents have an opportunity to meet their child's mentor at the beginning of the program and attend a graduation ceremony at the end of the twelve month experience.

The program aims to assist students in developing self-confidence, goal-setting and interpersonal skills, whilst promoting community involvement.

Freehills Connects @ 11

In this fortnightly program, Year 11 students are offered the opportunity to participate in a series of physical exercise sessions with Freehills mentors, designed to promote a healthy balance between lifestyle and study.

PADSIP

The Positive Ageing Digital Storytelling Intergenerational Project is part of the Year 9 curriculum and is supported by The Australian Centre for the Moving Image (ACMI). This program won a \$50,000 Schools First Impact Award for its innovative community partnership.

that came from it being a smaller school."

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
Hawthorn Secondary College is a co-educational school for students from Years 7 to 12.

The College serves the municipalities of Boroondara, Stonnington and Yarra, but has an open zone designation.

With modern facilities, an innovative Individualised Learning approach, and a relevant curriculum, the College attracts students from all parts of metropolitan Melbourne, the inner Eastern suburbs, regional Victoria and overseas.

The diversity of the student cohort and parent community is celebrated within the classroom, co-curricular activities, events and presentation evenings.

Students can readily access the school by train, tram and bus from Prahran, Malvern, South Yarra, Richmond, Camberwell, Southbank, South Melbourne and the Melbourne Central Business District. There is also bicycle access along the Gardiner Creek pathways.





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
